A few tips as we improve on our skills operating GG.

Most members are now registered with GG which means you log into GG using your email address and your password. This will automatically allow you to sign into a golf game you are booked for on the day of the event. The GGID code is applicable for guests and is unique to each game. It will direct your guest to the day's game for sign in.

Upon sign in, it will ask who you are to be a marker for then take you to your starting hole to commence scoring.

If you change your Golflink number because you have changed clubs etc., please advise us immediately or even better, update your profile on the app. Incorrect golflink numbers add a level of stress to running these days that can be easily avoided. Remember, if you would like to have your handicap maintained by QCGC, you can do this for a mere \$100 a year. So no excuses for a lapsed golflink number now!

From the committee's point of view the Golf Genius system is saving time after golf with scoring and selection of winners.

Remember when scoring stableford, if you have a wash, please enter a 9 for



your score for the hole, not an X as we have identified this as an issue at the end of the day's scoring!
